<p>Note: You have but one person to thank [or blame] for the star (*) rating system...me. Since I attended almost all presentations between 2000 to 2008, my opinion is based on the most comprehensive data available. About two years ago, one presenter complained that he was rated only 2 stars. Actually, he spent the better part of an hour wasting our time telling us about his personal life... His complaint prompted me to remove the stars... and, his presentation, but members kept asking me which presentation(s) would be a <i>best starting point</i>. All presentations contain value; however, some are better. After much thought, I sat back down and re-rated the presentations... again... thinking through all evaluation criteria I could imagine: applicability, content, pace, value, etc. Ratings are not based on the bell curve, but one will probably note that the majority are rated 3 stars while some were rated a 2 [the 2's have all been removed} and a few are rated 4 (best). Of the original 150 talks, about a unndred remain. So, 15 five star; 50 four stars; and 25 three stars. Most of the presentations include visuals; however, a few don't. We just didn't think about capturing vis</p>						
<p>To get the most from the recorded presentations we suggest you listen to one you 'think' you will like. If you like it, keep on listening to others on a periodic basis. Don't try too many at once... just one a day would probably be best. You might want to analyze the avaliable presentations using the different sorts and from your analysis, select the first 10 you believe will do you the most good, based on what you think you need. I'm convinced that if you are a studious observer, you could POSSIBLY learn to trade BY just listening to about 50 of the hundred presentations available.</p>
